Erasmus Policy Statement of University of Turku - Turun yliopisto (SF TURKU01)

The University of Turku (UTU) is an internationally active and attractive research university whose strength lies in high quality, multidisciplinary research. It is a diverse university community of almost 24 000 students and employees. We promote education and free science and provide higher education based on research. Our values are creativity, openness, ethical principles, critical thinking and strong communality, all resonating with Erasmus values including inclusiveness. We proactively foster both well-being and a sustainable future. The research conducted at UTU is ethical and scientifically excellent. It has significant impact and meets future global challenges. Close national and international collaboration strengthens our quality and impact.

We educate future experts who will solve complex scientific questions and social issues and build a sustainable world. The education we provide aims to encourage students towards independent critical thinking and achieving comprehensive learning goals. Our graduates have excellent collaboration skills, the ability to create work for themselves and others, and expertise that can be applied to different sectors of society. We offer attractive and broad ranging opportunities for the continuous development of expertise.

Erasmus+ programme is the base for organizing student and staff/teacher mobilities and for providing learning outcomes beyond UTU campus. Our students build individual degrees by selecting the most inspiring study modules from our multidisciplinary study tracks and from the curriculum offered by the partner universities. We continuously develop pedagogical and digital solutions in teaching and studying - International benchmarking and joint development is helping us in this task especially in creating blended mobility opportunities.
